THE STORY OF THE REFETTORIO

IT WAS A SUNNY FALL AFTERNOON; ALESSANDRO & I WERE SCOUT-ING A LOCATION FOR THE 2021 SUMMER FESTIVAL.

The revitalization of downtown is important to us, so we focused on looking for an outdoor space downtown. We were intrigued by this vacant lot that seemed to have been abandoned for years, right across from the YMCA. I brought a step ladder so we could peer over the boarded up wall to see what was on the other side, and immediately we were in love with the space. The exposed brick wall of the old Roy's Furniture Building, the canopy of this miraculous downtown tree (sadly it was dying and had to be removed), and the intimacy of the three walls enclosing the space, just made it a magical place to imagine theatre happening. From that moment forward, Alessandro would tell people "Oh, we're building a theatre there!" as if it was a done deal. At that moment, the Refettorio was born.

Alessandro's ability through sheer will and positivity to remind us that no hurdle was too great, is amazing! For instance, when the project jumped from \$345,000 to over \$1,000,000, my initial thought was "wow, that's way too much". But then we looked at what funding was available, crunched the numbers, and we were able to figure out a plan to make it work. Through that positivity, "can-do" attitude, and overwhelming desire from the public to see this thing happen, we were able to find our way from a small idea to a \$2,900,000 fully funded capital project - and a permanent arts and culture fixture in our downtown core.

Today, as I write this, I got to step onto the Refettorio stage for the first time. Sure, it's still just blocks of styrofoam, and outcrops of concrete and rebar, but the dream is becoming reality. What an incredible thing it is to stand in a space that was once just an idea in your head. What I'm most looking forward to now is how the space will engage the imagination of artists and audiences. I've already seen how Alessandro looks around the space and asks questions on how different areas can be used. "This little alley way - that could be a backstage area" or "that window could be Juliet's balcony". It's going to be a blank canvas for artists to explore and make their own.

Beyond that, I'm excited to see how our downtown changes because of it. It truly is unique to anywhere in the country, and when the artists in our community bring it to life, I think that life is just going to flow through the streets and completely transform the energy of the area.

As a theatre company, we do what we do to facilitate human connection - to move people. As an arts administrator, I do what I do to support that work; so that artists in my community have the resources they need to realize their impact. The Refettorio is a physical long-term resource that will be in our community for decades to come, ensuring that artists will always have a place that fills them with imagination... where they can share their imagination with the people of Sudbury.
